



VOLUNTEER ROLES & OPPORTUNITIES

Tech Trek relies on volunteers to make this program so successful. Here are some roles and opportunities to support girls in STEM!

Tech Trek Interviewer: Girls are selected for Tech Trek based on a teacher nomination, a personal statement, and an interview. We need female adults to support the interview process. We provide the interviewers with a packet of information about each girl, a list of questions and a rubric for evaluation. The interviewers speak with the girl and her parents/guardians (separately). Interviews take place in the evening (typically 5pm and later) or on Saturday mornings on the UAH campus. Interviewers will sign up for interview slots based on their availability.

Professional Women's Night Guests: Are you a female STEM professional? Come share your education and career experiences as a woman in STEM! Professional Women's Night is about mentoring the girls and advising them on what their role in STEM could be like. Professional Women's Night is held on the Thursday evening of camp week over dinner. You will speak with small groups of the girls throughout the event.

Camp Logistics: With over 80 campers, counselors, and teachers, we need volunteers to help with all the logistics and behind the scenes activities. We need people to help with activities like supply and camp kit assembly, camp check-in and check-out, camp snack and meal distribution, and much more.

Tech Trek Expo: A culminating event for Tech Trek, the Tech Trek Expo is where the girls show off everything they have learned during the week. You can help with guest check-in, logistics and set-up, and much more. The Expo is held on the Friday of camp.

Workshop Volunteers: Held throughout the week, workshops are held for smaller groups of campers. We need volunteers to support the workshop leaders, keep the girls on task, and other help as needed.
